- Safe



# **Principles of Improvement**

#### **Fundamental Concept of Improvement:**

"Every system is perfectly designed to achieve exactly the results it achieves"

#### **Principles of Improvement:**

- Understanding work in terms of processes and systems
- Developing solutions by teams of health care providers and patients
- Focusing on patient needs
- Testing and measuring effects of changes
- Shared learning

# 8 stones for governing quality

- Governing quality through the use of strategies, policies, and mechanisms
- Measuring and using quality improvement data
- Governing to develop a quality improvement culture
- Using regulatory techniques for governing quality
- Linking finance to quality
- Addressing the knowledge gap of quality care at various levels (global, local)
- Institutionalizing non-state involvement in pursuit of person-centered quality care
- Garnering political will to pursue quality
