

UHC training for USAID/Jakarta Health Office and Implementing Partners
February 3-5, 2016

Objectives of the Training: The training aims to help USAID/Jakarta and USAID Implementing Partner staff in Indonesia understand health financing principles and the options available to help Indonesia transition towards Universal Health Coverage (UHC). It will focus on the basics of health financing, pathways towards UHC, an overview of Indonesia's *Jaminan Kesehatan Nasional* (JKN) national health insurance scheme, and relevant case studies from other countries working to achieve UHC.

Expected outcomes: USAID and implementing partner staff are familiar with basic health financing, health insurance, and UHC concepts – in general and in the Indonesian context – and understand better how they can work within the JKN system to achieve their goals, including expanding access and improving quality of service delivery. Participants apply the learnings from this training to better engage local counterparts around UHC-related topics and support Indonesia's progress towards UHC through their ongoing work.

Approach: A variety of technical presentations, role plays, group and individual exercises, readings, and evaluation will be used to promote participant learning.

Participants: Participants will include approximately 20 USAID staff from the Jakarta Mission and approximately 20 staff from Jakarta-based implementing partners.
