OBJECTIVES OF CBHI



- **To provide day-to-day health services that is beneficial to the people**
- **Providing funds for health care services for the people of Ukana West and neighboring environs.**
- **Carrying out community and advocacy on health issues, sensitization and mobilization for health programs/seminars**
- **Conducting periodic monitoring and evaluation of the initiative to ensure achievement of purpose, minimization of waste, abuse of funds and provide for the health services.**
- **To support health promotion and prevention programs by the Local Government Areas of Akwa Ibom State and other health providers.**
- **Provision of periodic feedback to community members, health providers, LGA, Technical Facilitators.**
- **To reduced accessed to healthcare services using Out of Pocket Payment to the barest level.**

VISION



A community where all citizens have access to affordable quality health care services without suffering any hardship

MISSION



- **To provide accessible, sustainable and affordable health care services to the people of Ukana West Ward II by ensuring massive sensitization and mobilization of the citizenry for enrolment into the CBHI scheme**

- This is program managed and operated by the community for the pooling of resources and sharing of risk evenly among the contributors in order to access health care services without paying out of pocket at the point of service delivery.
- Not-for-profit health care financing mechanism based on solidarity (agreement, oneness) between members and democratically accountable Board of Trustees.





- **VDCs at village level**

COMMUNITY BASED HEALTH INITIATIVE CONT'D



- **Akwa Ibom State launched its Ward Based model of Community Based Health Insurance (CBHI) Scheme in August 2014. The CBHI scheme is currently being piloted in Ukana West Ward II in Essien Udim Local Government Area of Akwa Ibom State.**
- **The CBHI model is characterized by “Pooling at the Ward Level” with a “Community Trust Fund” at the Local Government Level. The scheme is managed by community members (selected through an open process) who make up the Board of Trustees (BoT) registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) as an entity.**
- **The scheme is regulated by the National Health Insurance Scheme, State Ministry of Health (SMoH) and the Local Government Authority (L.G.A), with the technical support of USIAD sponsored MSH. There is a Health Fund that is created to serve the CBHI scheme in paying for referral services and indigents enrollment.**

 - **Health funds**
 - **OOP/Co-Payment**

CBHI COMMITTEES



- **Drug Selection**
- **Drug Procurement**
- **Monitoring, supervision and evaluation**
- **Partners (SMoH, Community Medicine Dept, UUTCH, Local Government Service Commission, National Primary Health Care Unit, NHIS and MSH)**

CBHI SENSITIZATIONS



- **30 villages in Ukana and within Essien Udim.**
- **Over 96 Churches with approximately 6,200 persons have been sensitized on the CBHI scheme, 10 markets in Ukana West II and other wards within Essien Udim LGA.**
- **More so Schools and Okada riders have also be sensitised about the scheme.**

SERVICE UTILIZATION



- **730 lives have so far enrolled into the scheme.**
- **Out of the 730 lives, 374 enrollment services have expired.**
- **60 lives were referred to Cottage Hospital and 29 of them have accessed service.**
- **2, 400 lives have access services so far both the enrolled and the non enrollees.**
