BAUCHI STATE FORMAL SECTOR SCHEME

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THE HEALTH INSURANCE SCHEME EXPERIENCE:-

The National Health Insurance Scheme was officially launched in the State in 2008 for the State's civil servants.

× Formal Sector

The formal sector runs from 2008 to 2011, with a total of **66,912 lives** (State Government employees and their dependents were enrolled/covered).

× NHIS-MDGs/MCH Project

The NHIS-MDGs/MCH Project was designed to provide free health services for the pregnant women and children U-5 and was piloted from 2010-2014 in six LGAs, two LGAs from each senatorial district, namely-Toro, Bauchi, Katagum, Gamawa, Misau and Ningi LGAs. **740,912 lives enrolled**.

THE HEALTH INSURANCE SCHEME EXPERIENCE:- 2

<u>The Tertiary Institutions Social Health Insurance Programme</u> (TISHIP):

The programme was designed to cover students in higher institutions of learning. TISHIP is currently implementing in 8 institutions with a total of **37,427 students** enrolled.

<u>A HMOs and 129 Health Care Providers (78 PHCs, 23 Private Hospitals & Clinics, 3 Pharmacy Stores, 23 Gen Hospitals and 2 Tertiary Health Facilities)</u> were involved in implementing Health Insurance Scheme in the State

ACHIEVEMENTS:-

- Provision of free maternal health services such as deliveries, caesarian section, antinatal care.
- Treatment of common childhood illnesses such as malaria, pneumonia, malnutrition etc.
- Infrastructural improvement such as renovations, water supply, constructions of additional offices, latrines, sitting materials etc.

ACHIEVEMENTS:-2

- Purchase of hospital equipment e.g scanning machines, X-ray machines, Blood pressure apparatuses, stethoscopes, weighing scales etc.
- × Purchase of ambulances for some hospitals.
- Availability of drugs for the civil servants, pregnant women, children under five years and students of tertiary institutions.
- × Improvement in immunization coverage.

CHALLENGES:-

Lack of funding (capitation) which led to premature death of the formal sector and the NHIS-MDGs/MCH Programme in the State.
